






Why did the war begin? What do demilitarization and denazification mean? What is the difference between nationalism and Nazism? Who are Ukrainian Nazis? Who has ever seen them? What do they look like?

Goal:

- to analyse the nature and meaning of word DENAZIFICATION, its main derivatives and their connotation,
- to study the sources of its appearance.



Methods used:

- linguistic: lexical, semantic and phonological analysis, argumentation analysis;
- psycholinguistic analysis;
- discourse analysis and critical discourse analysis

Study Stages:

- 1) pre-reading monitoring of reference literature with the aim to define the meaning of 'Nazi" and 'nation' derived words; investigating approaches to the notions of Nazi, (de)nazification, nation in the past and present in historical literature;
- 2) while-reading general evaluation of the contents by skimming the transcript of Putin's speech, scanning the transcript for detecting all cases of using Nazi and nation related words, multiple reading of the transcript for identifying the cases of notion substitution and manipulation;
- 3) conclusion on each case detected;
- 4) general conclusions on the text of the speech on the base of textual, psycholinguistic and discourse analysis done.

CONCLUSIONS

The linguistic, psycho-linguistic and discourse analytical research done allowed to reveal that Nazi-derived words and the term "denazification" were systematically and purposefully used in Putin's speech for the following purposes:


- 1. to demonise Ukrainians and Ukrainian government;
- 2. to build negative associations based on Second World War archetypes;
- 3. to distort reality, misinform and manipulate mass consciousness;
- 4. to justify the call for violence against Ukraine;
- 5. to legitimise full scale invasion, euphemistically called 'special military operation'.
